PASTORAL LETTER FROM THE ARCHBISHOP 2004

Brethren:

With the constant growth of the Province of Christ the King it is time for me to assume the full responsibility of being Archbishop. As of Holy Saturday, April 10, 2004, I will dedicate all my efforts to serving as chief pastor of the Province. For this, the Archbishop is granted the privilege of Visitation to any diocese or parish in the Church. As the Province continues to develop, the opportunity to be personally available for the bishops, priests and people will increase. Yet, I wish to give most of my energy to the continued building of the Saint Joseph of Arimathea College, the promotion of vocations to the sacred ministry, and the establishment of student centers at colleges throughout the United States.

As we celebrate the bodily resurrection of Our Lord this Easter, we affirm again the victory of Christ over those forces of darkness that would lead us into meaningless nihilism, erode the moral foundations of Christian Civilization, and who see life extinguished by death. Twenty-seven years ago, the Province of Christ the King chose to stand firmly beneath the banner, "His Kingdom shall have no end." We offer to our times not a legacy of despair, but the affirmation that God is our beginning and end. As Saint Paul says, He is in whom, "we live, and move and have our being." We share the reality that love is always victorious because Christ is risen.

The blessing of God Almighty the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost be amongst you and remain with you.

2004 SYNOD FOR THE DIOCESE OF THE EASTERN STATES

The 13th Annual Synod for our Diocese was held on June 19th through the 22nd at St. Alban's Anglican Church in Pine Grove, Pennsylvania. A Synod is a formal Church meeting of clergy and laity coming together to discuss important matters concerning the state of the Diocese. Our particular Diocese is made up of the states of Connecticut, Illinois, Kentucky, Maine, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin.

Attending from our parish were Father Hines and Deacon Schultz, Mark Maute, Chuck Carr, Bill Jepson, Wayne Holman, Will and Marie Spencer. Mark, Chuck and Bill attended in the capacity of parish delegates, Wayne as a member of our Diocese's Standing Committee, and Marie as the Diocesan Altar Guild Directress and ACW Diocesan Treasurer/ACW delegate.

In addition to daily Mass celebrations and Morning and Evening Prayer services, the Diocesan ACW held a conference. Three workshops were presented on the topics of *Our Anglican Identity*, *The Role of Clergy Wives*, and *Anglican Youth Ministries*. Three men were approved to become postulants for Holy Orders (two for the priesthood and one for the perpetual diaconate). At the formal business meeting itself the budget of the Diocese was reviewed and approved by all voting attendees, and officers for various diocesan committees were elected and approved. Our own Chuck Carr is on the Board of Directors; Wayne Holman is on the Standing Committee and the Provincial Court; Deacon Schultz is Diocesan Secretary; Fr. Hines is on the Ecclesiastical Court, Discernment Committee on Ministry, the Board of Examining Chaplains, and the Marriage Tribunal; Ron Waitek is on the Ecclesiastical Court; Marie Spencer is the Diocesan Altar Guild Directress and ACW Diocesan

Treasurer. The meeting came to an end with a final blessing from our Bishop.

The Synod concluded on Saturday with 6 confirmations at St. Alban's, the host parish. In his homily, Bp. Florenza spoke to the confirmands on the gifts of the faith they had received, not only the gifts of the Holy Ghost to see them through this life, but also the gift of their parish family and the Church to support and sustain them in their walk with the living Christ.

All in all it was a very fruitful few days spent in dealing with important business for our Diocese and a nice time spent in fellowship amongst the faithful. Next year's Synod is scheduled to be hosted by the Anglican Church of the Ascension in Coventry, Connecticut.

\$100 MONTH CLUB

The College of Bishops meeting at Saint Thomas' Church in San Francisco on April 21, 2004 expressed the desire that every parish and mission within the Province participates in the Hundred-Dollars-a-Month Club. This program asks that each parish throughout the Province donate \$100 on a monthly basis towards the Seminary in California. The Bishops announced that the priority of the Church lies in future vocations to the sacred ministry coupled with an active support of the Province's seminary, Saint Joseph of Arimathea. All Saints Parish used to participate in this program but we stepped out when we took on the responsibility of sponsoring a full-time seminarian. Our seminarian has graduated and moved on to Holy Orders now, and therefore we will once again participate in the Hundred-Dollars-a-Month Club.

DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

The Committee will take care of setting up an All Saints Booth at the Annual Village of Bolingbrook Picnic that will be held on **Sunday, June 27**, on the grounds of the Village Municipal Center on Briarcliff Road, from 12:00 Noon to 4:00 p.m. This annual event features local civic organizations, churches and businesses and is an opportunity for us to make our presence known in the

community. The Committee will be contacting members to assist at our booth, and everyone is encouraged to come to the Picnic area after Mass. It is only a few blocks south of the church.

In June, the Committee will complete the All Saints Parish Survey that will be distributed to every member the first week of July. This survey will be designed to assist the Clergy and the Vestry in planning for the future by gathering the opinions and recommendations of the parish on all of our activities and to identify the projects that need to be considered to complete our facilities. Complete results will be published in early August 2004.

PROVINCIAL PILGRIMAGE

The Provincial Pilgrimage to Fond du Lac, Wisconsin will be held on Friday, September 23rd and Saturday, September 24th. The Pilgrimage is an opportunity for the entire Province to gather at the shrine of the saintly Bishop Charles Grafton, who in his holy life was an icon of the Christian faith. On Friday afternoon, Father Paul Russell,

Ph.D. will give a seminar on "The Desert Fathers". Father Russell is a recognized scholar of the Early Church and a noted academic among us. To hear Father Russell speak is a wonderful opportunity for both clergy and laity alike. On Friday there will be a National Clericus, a meeting of the College of Bishops, and an Alumni lunch open to everyone for Saint Joseph of Arimathea Theological College.

The Pilgrimage to the shrine will be on Saturday morning at 10:00 AM. Preceded by the Fond du Lac High School band, we will process through the streets of Fond du Lac from the hotel to the Cathedral. Saint Paul's Cathedral, which was built by Bishop Grafton, without parallel, is one of the most beautiful church edifices in the United States. It is worth visiting itself. Following the Pontifical Mass at the Cathedral and the pilgrimage to the shrine of Bishop Grafton, the pilgrims will celebrate with a lunch in the hotel and receive the blessed pilgrim's badge.

This is a wonderful opportunity for prayer and fellowship amongst all the Bishops and laity of the whole Province.

NEWS FROM AROUND THE PROVINCE

The Right Rev. James Eugene Provence was installed as the second Bishop of the Diocese of the Western States at the opening of the Diocesan Synod at Saint Augustine's Church in Chico, California. On Thursday, April 22, 2004, the Archbishop, in union with the College of Bishops, received Bishop Provence and invested him with full authority, both temporal and spiritual, as Chief Pastor of the Diocese of the Western States. The Right Rev. Rocco A. Florenza, Bishop of the Diocese of the Eastern States was the preacher during the Solemn Liturgy of the Installation of the Bishop.

The Parish of Christ the King in Washington, D.C., representing the Province joined with 200,000 others in the annual March for Life in our nation's capital on January 22nd, the 31st anniversary of the Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court decision. The Province holds the orthodox belief that the soul of an individual begins at conception.

The Archdiocese of Washington, D.C held an Archdiocesan Evangelism Conference on February 8th. The Conference was led by Fr. Ron Winchell, and was hosted by St. Athanasius parish in Ashland, Virginia. The Conference closed with an open discussion and a reception.

Dr. Norman Flowers was ordained Deacon on March 13th, by the Rt. Rev. Rocco Florenza, Ordinary of the Diocese of the Eastern States, at Grace Church, in Louisville, Kentucky. The Rev. Flowers has been

appointed Deacon Vicar at the new parish of St. Peter's in Nashville, Tennessee.

Fr. Samuel Edwards, once a prominent priest in ECUSA, has accepted a call as assistant at the Anglican Church of the Holy Comforter in Montevallo, Alabama, and assumed that ministry on April 1st.

Brad Hulen was ordained Deacon on May 7th, by Archbishop Robert Morse, at the Synod of the Diocese of the Southern States, and was assigned to Holy Comforter parish in Montevallo, Alabama.

Fr. Edward Jones of St. Mary's Church in Plano, Texas, is on a sabbatical. He has been succeeded as rector by Fr. David Cardona.

Fr. Bill Cantrell has been licensed by Bishop Frederick Morrison to assist at St. George's parish in Las Vegas, Nevada.
