## SENIOR WARDEN’S REPORT

**T**he All Saints Parish Family has received the invitation to the Ordination of Deacon Blair Schultz on Saturday, June 24, and to the luncheon which follows the service. It is so important for all of us to return the R.S.V.P. card to ACW President Sue Ross by June 17 as requested, so firm plans can be made for the service and the luncheon – and children are certainly to be included. Our Bishop, the Rt. Reverend Rocco A. Florenza, will officiate and other clergy of the Diocese will participate in the Rite of Ordination. On Sunday, June 25, then Father Schultz will celebrate his First Mass at All Saints, with a reception in his honor afterwards. We hope that everyone will be with us for the “Ordination Weekend,” which promises to be a very unique and meaningful experience.

**A**t its meeting on Sunday, May 21, the Vestry elected our delegates to the 2006 Synod of our Diocese, to be held at the Holy Apostles Church, Pewaukee, Wisconsin, June 8-10. Pewaukee is only about two hours away, and you should consider driving up for the High Mass and Brunch on Saturday, June 10, at 10:00 a.m. A special registration fee of \$15.00 is available for All Saints members for this day. ### BOOK REVIEW

*The Catholic Religion: A manual of instruction for members of the Anglican Communion* by Vernon Staley

C.S. Lewis once said that for every newly written book he reads, he tries to read at least one old book. This is good advice, especially for the Christian. The classics of Christian literature are basically unmatched by many modern writings. Today there are books being printed under the guise of "Christian" which offer no real content dealing with the Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Many so-called Christian books of today are about "self, self, self": self-empowerment, self-improvement, self-actualization.

*The Catholic Religion*, by Vernon Staley, is not one such book however. This book is a "classic" – being written at a time when the faith was "the Faith" and no aberrations were allowed consideration. It really isn't even that old – it was written around 1890 – going to show just how much has changed in Christian circles between then and now.

I would recommend this book to every layman who has questions about the fundamentals of the Christian Faith. As a matter of fact it is the book used by many clergy to instruct confirmands. With great detail and powerful prose Vernon Staley explains many points of our belief which the average person is often puzzled about. The reader will walk away with a better understanding of his faith and, if carefully studied, will have garnered for himself a knowledge that will lead to a fuller expression of the Christian Life.

May God bless us all to use every good means available "till we come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ : that we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of man, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; but speaking truth in love, may grow up into Him in all things, which is the head, even Christ." (Ephesians 4:13-15)
