## THANK YOU, JEFF DAVID

On Sunday, May 31, 2009, Jeff David completed ten years as our Organist/Choirmaster. There was a special presentation and reception following Mass to honor Jeff for his dedication to God and All Saints Anglican Church. Father Schultz began by reminiscing about the beginning days of the Parish when there was no full-time organist. On most Sundays, he said, the clergy attempted to lead the singing of the hymns. Then in June 1999, Jeff was asked to become the temporary Church organist and that temporary position lasted ten years. To thank Jeff for his service to All Saints, Father Schultz presented him with a desk clock on behalf of the Vestry and Parish. The clock was engraved as follows:

## PARISH MEMORIAL BOOK

We are in the process of updating the Parish Memorial Book. To that end we need your help. In the Fall of 2006, the Parish purchased Vestments and Altar Hangings. Parishioners were invited to donate funds to purchase these items. At the time, it was stated, "All contributions, both big and small, will be acknowledged in the Parish Memorial Book.... This book will list the names of the donors and it will list the reason for which the donation was given, such as memorials, in honor of family members, anniversaries, etc." Unfortunately, we don't have a complete list of who contributed to this project and if the contribution was for a specific purpose. As of now, we don't know the source of the funds for the Green Set, the Red Set, the black Clergy Cope, the black Funeral Pall, and the Jacobean Frontal. (We do know the source of the funds for the White Set, the Purple Set, and the Black Set.) If you contributed money to purchase a set or part of a set of Vestments, please let Father Schultz know. Also, let him know if the contribution was for a specific reason. Thank you.

## **SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT**

The Vestry met on Sunday, May 17. Following are the highlights of this meeting:

- Approved an expenditure of \$900 to purchase a wheelchair ramp for the Nave, which is now required by the State of Illinois. Even though only clergy and authorized laity are allowed behind the rail during our services, the law provides no exemptions for churches. Those in wheelchairs or on crutches have no problem receiving communion at the Altar Rail, but we still must have this ramp available to enable anyone with a mobility problem to have access to the Sanctuary. This is another "mandate" we must adhere to, and we are fortunate that we can afford it.
- Noted that we will post a sign for "handicapped seating" in the Nave at a location convenient for wheel chairs. This is also a State of Illinois requirement.
- Father Schultz appointed an Outreach Committee composed of Sue Ross, Libby Bolton and Deacon Wilson, Chair. This committee will make recommendations to the Vestry for the funding of charitable projects and agencies. There is \$1,500 in the 2009 Parish Budget for outreach.
- Accepted the offer of Janis and Chuck Semaan to host a Fourth of July Party for the parish at their home in Romeoville.
- Noted that the new organ will be installed on June 1 and that our new Organist/Choirmaster, George Tarasuk, will begin on Sunday, June 7.
- Agreed to seek at least three estimates to repair cracks, seal coat and re-stripe the parking lot this summer, with the final decision being made by the Vestry at their June meeting.
- Noted that a "Girls' Day Out," sponsored by the ACW, will be held on Saturday, June 13. A signup sheet is in the Narthex.
- It was announced that a second Venture Scout Troop organizational meeting will be held at the church on Tuesday evening, June 2, with a report on the progress of the program at the June Vestry meeting.
- Noted the ACM and ACW will meet on Sunday, June 14.

We bid farewell to Bill Gelert, who is joining Cynthia and two daughters in Switzerland. Cynthia and Bill co-chaired the 2007 and 2008 Parish Picnics, and Bill served as an usher and was a member of the Vestry since January, 2008. We wish Bill and Cindy all the best in this new venture.

You probably noticed that the interior of our "new" front doors have been stained, thanks to Dan Brush, and he will need to make two additional applications to finish the job. Painting the red exterior of the doors is next. And, thanks to Paul Drayton for spraying the weeds in all the planted areas around the main sign and the building.

The Fourth of July Party will begin at 3:30 PM at the home of Janis and Chuck Semaan in Romeoville. There is a signup sheet in the Narthex, and you are asked to consider bringing an hors d'oeuvre, side dish or dessert, with everything else provided. If you have any questions, please call Janis and Chuck.

Let us hope that the gift Father Schultz presented to Jeff David on Sunday, May 31, will always serve as a reminder of our appreciation for Jeff's years of service to All Saints.
