BIBLE STUDY

Father Schultz will lead a six week Bible Study beginning Sunday, September 20, from 8:30 to 9:15 AM. The topic will be “The Seven Signs of Christ” in St. John’s Gospel. “Signs” is the word St. John uses in his Gospel for Jesus’ miracles. Christ’s works were not simply wonders or acts of power, but works which signified previously hidden truths about the Kingdom of God. Materials will be provided, so there is no book to purchase. However, the class will be based upon the book by Lawrence R. Farley, *The Gospel of John: Beholding the Glory*. Ben Lomond, CA: Conciliar Press, 2006. This book can be purchased from Amazon.com. If you order the book through the parish website, a portion of the purchase price comes back to the Church. Please sign the sheet in the Narthex if you are planning to attend, so we’ll know how many people to expect.

SENIOR WARDEN’S REPORT

Your Vestry met on Sunday, August 16, and following is a summary of this meeting:

- Expressed appreciation for the success of the Parish Family Picnic on Sunday, August 9, to the Co-Chairs: Karen and Ron Waitek and Chris and Bob Oschman.



- Accepted the Treasurer's Report for July, 2009; noted that full payment has been made for completing the installation of new furnaces and air conditioners and that "Pledge Sunday" will be scheduled for Sunday, November 15.
- The electrical boxes for the "old" air conditioners at the rear entrance were removed in mid-August as a part of the contract for the electrical work done on the west side of the building. The Landscape Committee (Carol O'Sullivan, Dan Brush and Bill Jepson) is to prepare a plan to landscape this area for discussion at the September Vestry meeting.
- Approved the basic plans and budget for the official visit of Archbishop Provence, November 7-11, to mark the first anniversary of the Consecration of the Church Building. A Solemn High Mass will be held on Sunday, November 8, at which time the Cross and Corpus over the Altar and the new Organ will be blessed. A reception will be held in the Narthex followed by a Vestry meeting with the Archbishop. A former Marine, the Archbishop will attend the Marine Corps Birthday Ball in Naperville on November 10.
- Received a report from Chuck Bolton, Sunday School Administrator, on plans for 2009-2010, with the program beginning on Sunday, September 13.
- Discussed the progress being made for the organization of the Venture Crew Scout Troop that the parish is sponsoring, with Father Schultz and Deacon Wilson as our liaisons for 2009-2010.
- Received a report on the plans being made by the Outreach Committee, Deacon Wilson, Chair. Information is to be provided in each issue of the parish newsletter.
- Discussed a proposal from the Olan Mills Company to produce a 2010 Church Directory that will feature photographs of all parish members and families in addition to the information always provided. Sue Ross and Chris Oschman will provide details, so the Vestry can consider the project and make a decision at the September meeting.
- Noted that the clergy will offer a Bible Study Class on "the Seven Signs of Christ" in St. John's Gospel, Sunday, September 20, through Sunday, October 25, at 8:30 AM in the Conference Room. A signup sheet is available in the Narthex.
- Father Schultz noted that he will be on vacation until September 11, with a Deacon's Liturgy on Sunday, August 30, and Sunday, September 6. If there are any personal or church business needs, please contact Deacon Wilson at 630-393-0896 (home) or 630-712-9757 (cell).
